Record of Elder Charles L. Foote as an missionary in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Saints  
I bid fairwell to my family and friends December 2<sup>th</sup> 1906.

In company with Elders Louis Jorgenson and Leonard Broderick drove to L. D. had dinner with Mary Browning Arrived at price that evening Stayed all night at the Lowery hotel

3<sup>th</sup> Boarded the train at price arrived at Salt Lake City 3 o'clock registered at the Independence hotel

4<sup>th</sup> Called at the presidents office at 10 A.M. made arrangements for tickets. got set apart at 2 P.M. by Elder Seymour B. Young



5<sup>th</sup> Left S. L. C. at 7.10 A.M.  
 changed cars at Ogden  
 to the U. P. line via Weber  
 canyon saw the devil's slide  
 delayed five hours on account  
 of wreck seven coaches were  
 thrown from the track and  
 no body killed

6<sup>th</sup> Arrived at Cheyenne 8.00  
 A.M. changed cars and went  
 to Denver had dinner started  
 for Kansas City 1.30 o'clock P.M.

7<sup>th</sup> Arrived at Kansas City 8  
 A.M. Layed over until 9 P.M.  
 visited the mission house  
 also the Swift packing Co.  
 plant also Independence and  
 the temple block

8<sup>th</sup> Arrived at St Louis 7 A.M.  
 Layed over took in the sites  
 until 10. o'clock next day  
 having purchased our tickets



for Chattanooga  
 9<sup>th</sup> We crossed the Mississippi river the Ohio and the Tennessee arrived at Chattanooga at 9 o'clock A.M. next day  
 10<sup>th</sup> Registered at the Williams house Layed around all day  
 11<sup>th</sup> We got our books and cloths. then road out to the lookout, mts. road up the cable line that is almost straight up where you can see seven states and four battle fields where the famous battle was fought above the clouds also the great Moccasin bend in the Tenn. river. We climbed upon the Umbrella rock  
 12<sup>th</sup> went down to the Tenn river forenoon. afternoon went out to the national cemetery where lies 12,965 soldiers



who lost there lives in  
the civil war.

13<sup>th</sup> Layed around all day  
waiting for president rich  
to come from N. C. conference  
he arrived at 3 P.M.

14<sup>th</sup> President Rich visited us  
at the hotel and arranged us  
to our fields of labor. I and  
Elder White was sent to Jack-  
sonville Florida

15<sup>th</sup> Left Chatt. at 7 o'clock  
A.M. arrived at Atlanta Geo.  
at 2 P.M. walked the town  
over took the train at 10 P.M.  
arrived at Jessup at 7 A.M.

16<sup>th</sup> waited until noon for  
our train arrived at Jackson-  
ville at 4 o'clock P.M. reported  
to the Mission house found  
all the elders there for  
conference held meeting that  
night stayed all night at



bro. Ashleys

17<sup>th</sup> boarded at the mirrion  
 house rested up all day  
 waiting for conference  
 attended street meeting  
 at 7.30 P.M. had quite a good  
 crowd after which a preacher  
 of some church spoke ridiculous  
 about our Leaders.

18<sup>th</sup> conference convened at  
 10 A.M. Elders B H Roberts and  
 G. Smith occupied the time  
 and gave many good  
 instructions. again at  
 2 P.M. and at 7 P.M. at night  
 which was for everybody  
 we had a good turnout

19<sup>th</sup> priesthood meeting at  
 10 A.M. president Rich spoke  
 and gave many good  
 instructions



20<sup>th</sup> Priesthood meeting was called at noon when president Leallis assigned us to our fields of labor. I and Elder Bay and White and Spangenberg was sent to Tampa and surrounding country. We sailed from Jackson ville on the boat City of Jackson ville at 5 P.M. for Sanford a distance of 200 miles.

21<sup>st</sup> We arrived at Sanford at 10 A.M. waited for the train until 3 P.M. Took the train to Conohy then walked 4 miles to Uncle Dan prescott was ~~royally~~ treated.

22<sup>nd</sup> Layed over at Uncle Dams had a good time picking and eating oranges.

23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Still at Uncle Dams held



Sacramento meeting  
Spoke for the first time  
and bore my testimony  
to the truth of the  
gospel

24<sup>th</sup> Still at uncle davis  
the boys are out hunting  
and i am writing my  
journal

25<sup>th</sup> Christmas morning  
had breakfast at sister  
percots then walked  
over to boggy creek  
had met with the saints  
and had lunch and  
held meeting Stayed a  
night at brother Storys

26<sup>th</sup> brother story taken out to  
kissimmee in his wagon had  
dinner with brother brunson  
Took the train at 6 P.M.  
arrived at Tampa at 9 P.M.  
Registered at the Commercial



hotel which was 75 cents  
 27<sup>th</sup> went to the P.O. and  
 there received two letters  
 from home the first I have  
 received also one from the  
 mission with 10. dollars in  
 it which was gladly received  
 walked around town and  
 took in the sites do not  
 feel very well

28<sup>th</sup> I and Elder Fay  
 started for Sefer walking  
 about 7 miles and had  
 dinner with a Mr  
 Williams left him some  
 tracts and went on to  
 brother's or lines arrived  
 there about sundown  
 having walked 15 miles  
 found them feeling well  
 but one son which was  
 sick



29<sup>th</sup> at bro. orlines had  
 prayer and administered  
~~it~~ to their son willie  
 borrowed a horse and buggy  
 and went back to nar  
 williams after Elder Pay bible  
 having left it there the  
 day before I wrote a letter  
 to my wife and children

30<sup>th</sup> Sunday morning  
 after breakfast we admi-  
 nistered to willie again  
 he seemed to be better

31<sup>th</sup> we left for Blooming  
 Dale about 8 miles distance  
 distributed some 32 tracts  
 arrived at sister sternes  
 about 3 o'clock held meeting  
 at night

January 1<sup>st</sup> 1907 new years morning  
 we left sister sternes this  
 morning for Keyville  
 walked 10 miles to sister



Jerdon stayed all night  
there nothing going on  
for Newyears

 from home

 and road to St. Petersburg  
 it is a very nice Place  
 I didnt stay there but a few  
 minutes, Took the train for  
 Ozona arrived there about  
 noon then walked out  
 to brother Fleming a Bout  
 four miles away



We arrived at their place at three o'clock, found them all well and seem to be strong in the faith

23<sup>rd</sup> Treated fine get plenty cat. Brother Fleming killed a Florida rooster this morning, went out to notify the people about preaching tomorrow and give away some tracts and had a few conversations on the gospel.

24<sup>th</sup> Sunday went over to lake Butler, a lake seven miles long and full of fish, only about a quarter of a mile from here, studied some forenoon held three meetings after noon and evening had a fine time talking and singing.

25<sup>th</sup> Monday started out tracting went down to Seaside to the



gulf coast waded out in  
the ocean a ways. walked  
about ten miles

26<sup>th</sup> walked over to Mr. Dubiles  
had a talk with him said  
he was ready to be baptised  
appointed a meeting for  
friday night. then afternoon  
went over to Keystone park  
to see brother Holley. held a  
meeting with them that  
night had a good time

27<sup>th</sup> Layed over today reading  
H. C. Kimbell. little book found  
it very interesting had several  
gospel conversations

28 started back for brother  
flemings. we got in a swampy  
and got wet up to my pants  
had a boat ride cross lake  
buttle and the waves were  
rooling high. but got across  
alright. had a bath afternoon in the lake

Studied some and wrote some letters walked down to the P.O. about four miles and got our mail, then went up to Mr Daniles and held a meeting that night had a splendid time wrote with bro. Fleming over to his place after meeting

2<sup>nd</sup> Studied some forenoon went over to Mr Danille to talk with him expect to baptize him tomorrow stayed all night with him

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Fast day

Held meeting at eleven o'clock. at two held baptism. baptized two. Mr Daniel and Joseph Fleming. held two meetings in the evening had a splendid time
